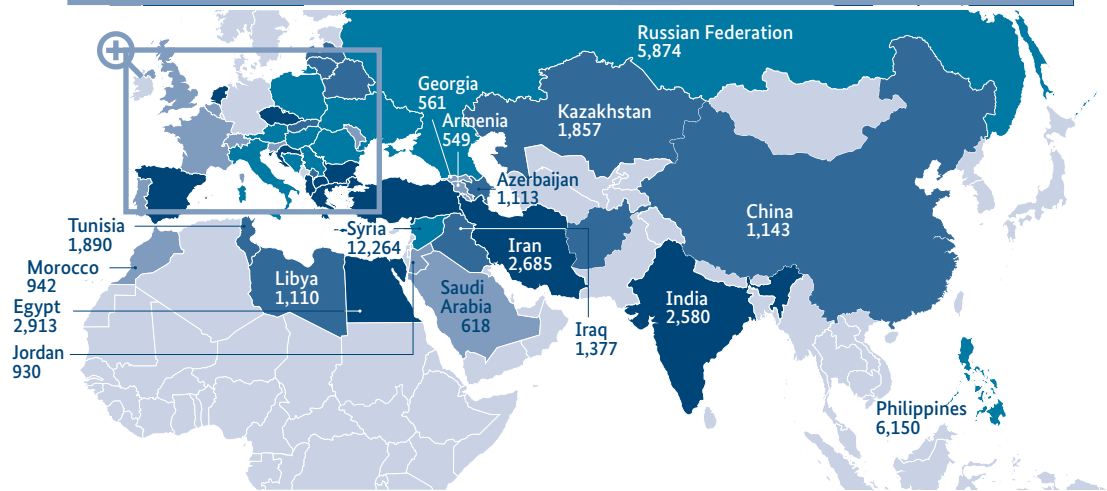
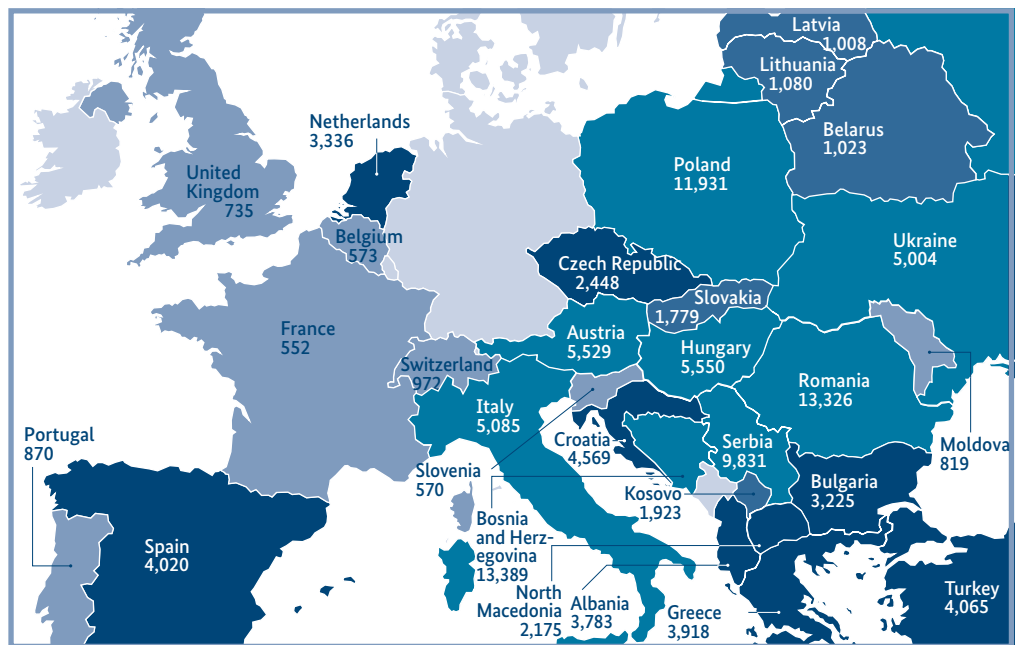

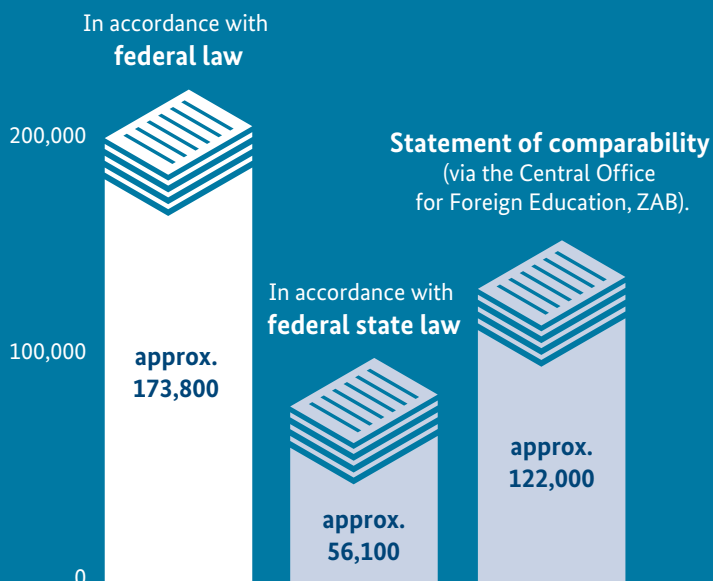
Applications by countries of training 2012 bis 2019

- über 5,000 applications



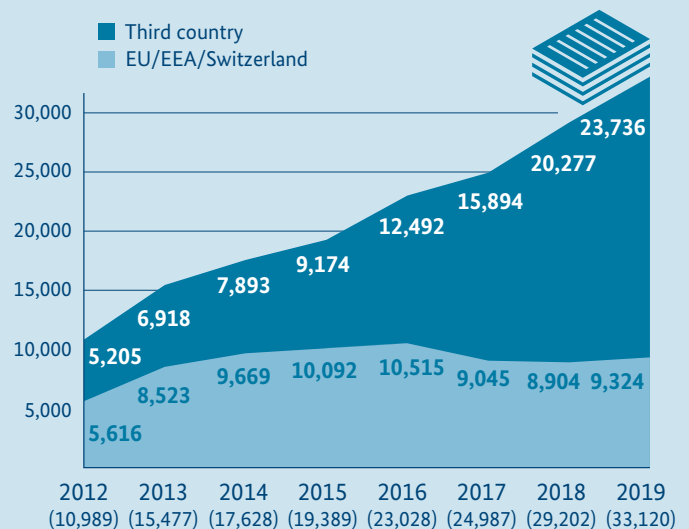
Recognition in accordance with federal law/federal state law and statement of comparability

Around 351,900 applications 2012–2019



A recognition procedure is conducted in accordance with federal or federal state law depending on the profession. A ZAB statement of comparability may also be carried out for non-regulated higher education qualifications.

Rising numbers of applications—especially regarding qualifications from third countries



Difference to overall total: no information on country of training.



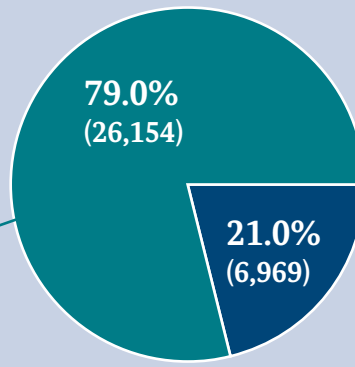
Around **100,000** fully recognised qualifications 2012 to 2019



No equivalence in only just under **4,700** cases

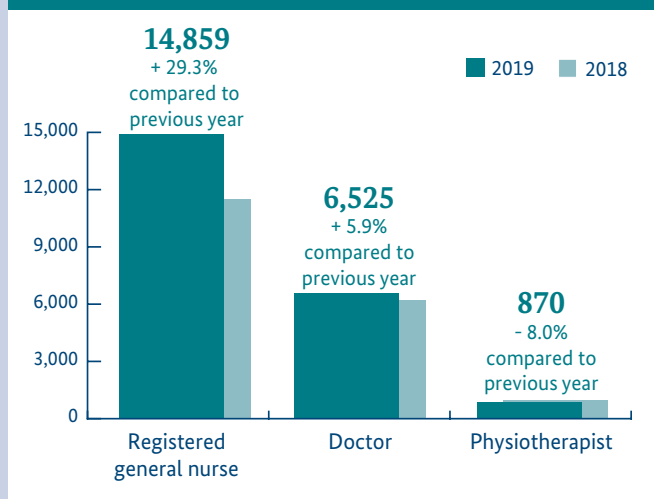

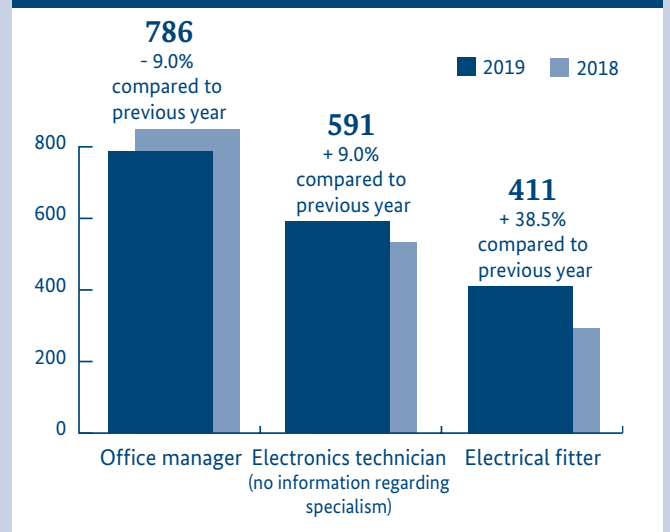


Non-regulated professions

Professions with most applications – non-regulated

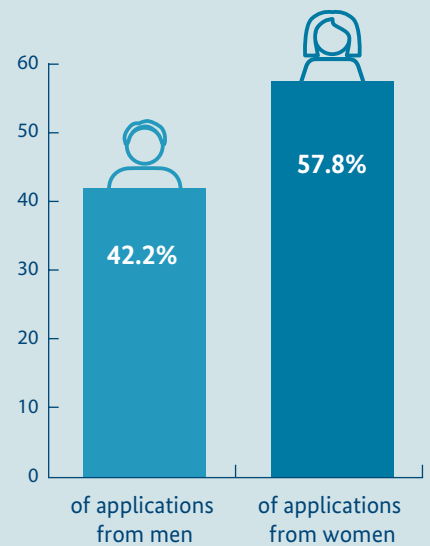


Almost **80 percent** of all applications made in 2019 were in a medical healthcare profession.



Almost **30 percent** of all applications made in 2019 were submitted from abroad.

Women submitted more applications for recognition in 2019 than men.



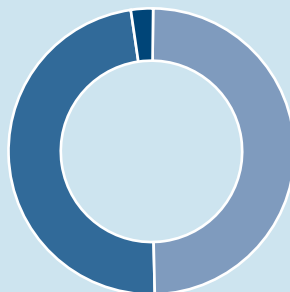
34,695 recognition procedures in 2019 in which a decision was reached

27,819 notices regarding regulated professions



- 50.4% full equivalence
- 46.9% resulted in a notice "imposing" a compensation measure
- 2.6% negative

6,876 notices regarding non-regulated professions



- 49.3% full equivalence
- 48.0% partial equivalence
- 2.7% negative
